For international business publications see Proquest and Ebscohost (Academic Source and Business Source Premier) databases. Browse publications using terms such as “international” and “global.” Some examples of titles are *Global Economic Outlook*, *Global Investor*, *International Banker*, *International Business Review*, *International Economic Review*, *International Executive*, and *International Finance*. In both Proquest and Ebscohost, you may choose limiters such as “scholarly (peer-reviewed) journals.”
