- End of term report: - the data freeze will be done 2 days after the end of the term. The report will be generated 3 business days after the data freeze.

The FTE for high school students is the sum of up all countable credit hours of all high school students (concurrent enrollment, ASCENT and self-pay high school students) divided by 30 credits.
