Program Outcomes

- Analyze and interpret works studied via thesis-driven essays using documented, evidential support.

Notes

- *This course requires college level readiness as measured by Accuplacer, ACT, or SAT scores; approved high school course work that is less than five years old; or successful completion of appropriate college-readiness course.
- **Literature: Students are required to take a total of five (5) LIT courses (15 credits), four (4) of which must be at the 200-level. It is recommended that students take LIT 115- Introduction to Literature and then choose four (4) from the remaining LIT courses: LIT 201 World Literature to 1600, LIT 202 World Literature After 1600, LIT 205 Ethnic Literature, LIT 211 American Literature to the Civil War, LIT 212 American Literature after the Civil War, LIT 221 British Literature to 1770, LIT 222 British Literature Since 1770, LIT 225 Introduction to Shakespeare, LIT 246 Literature of Women, LIT 259 Survey of African American Literature, LIT 268 Celtic Literature.
- ***Arts / Humanities: GT-AH2 Literature courses will not be accepted to fulfill this requirement.
- AAA 101 College 101: Student Experience is required for all new college students seeking degrees or transfer.
- Course availability is subject to change.
