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YEAR IN REVIEW

As we approach the second anniversary of the opening of Sturm Collaboration Campus, we know that our close collaboration and partnerships with Douglas County High Schools, Colorado State University, the Arapahoe/Douglas Workforce Center, the surrounding community, and regional industry gave us the foundation for success during the COVID-19 crisis. As mentioned in our July, 2020 report, the campus team intentionally created

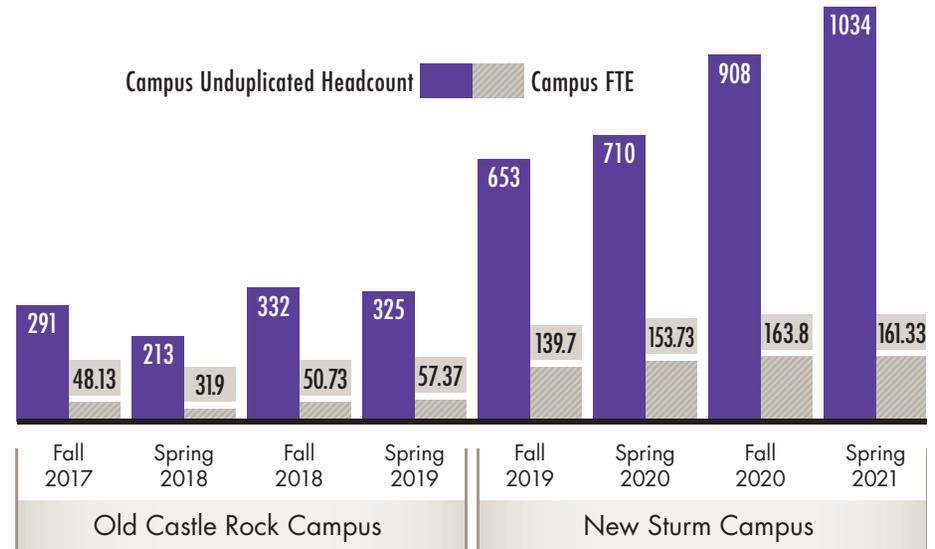


a mix of virtual synchronous, remote asynchronous, and hybrid-in person course sections in order to provide a diversified menu of options for students while keeping the safety and security of students, staff, faculty, and community at the forefront of the planning efforts. These efforts proved to be invaluable as the weeks became months, and months to over a year.

In what was the most unprecedented year, the ACC Sturm Collaboration Campus continued to see enrollment growth unlike many of Colorado's other community colleges who continue to see enrollment decline. We are confident that the work of our strategic enrollment planning for the Sturm Collaboration Campus headed up by our Navigators and supported by the ACC Sturm Collaboration Campus team are directly related to that success.

Through the utilization of ACC's student success platform, [Navigate](#), we can see that ACC Sturm Navigators had 4,269 student appointments totaling over 3,500 hours of individual student meetings this past academic year. The holistic approach between navigators and the Navigate tool, provides students with ongoing robust and proactive advising support. We seamlessly provided virtual appointments for the thousands of students we served during the height of the pandemic.

Although we were unable to formally celebrate the first anniversary of the opening of the Sturm Collaboration Campus in August 2020 due to COVID, we remain confident in our continued work and leadership in reframing the way industry and education partner to meet industry needs and student demand and ultimately our vision to reform the talent pipeline ecosystem.



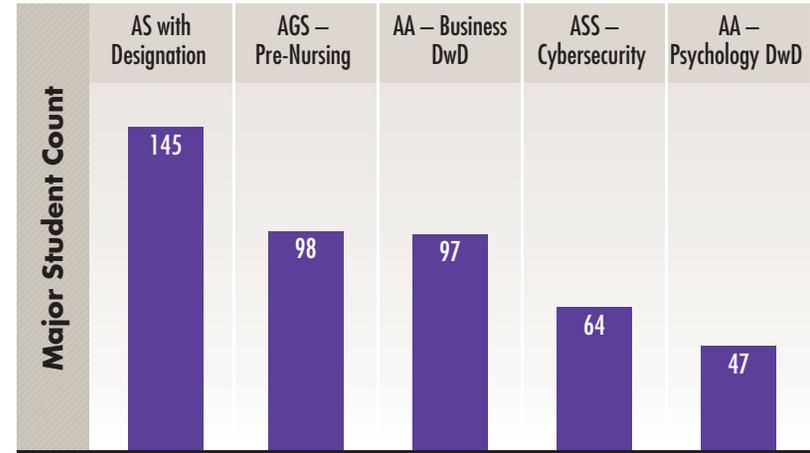
For example, in Fall 2020, ACC student [Maston Leit](#), a veteran of our military, was selected for Lockheed Martin’s highly selective Software Associate Degree Program (SWAP). Focused on building a talent pipeline, Lockheed reports their program is a “three-year development program designed to attract, develop and retain early-career technical professionals in software and cyber-related careers”. Maston will earn a salary around \$50,000 annually during the 3 year training program.

According to Lockheed, students are accepted in the program before they graduate with their associate degree to accelerate the clearance process and be ready to join Lockheed Martin after graduation.

Maston will complete his Cybersecurity AAS degree at the end of summer, 2021. He began his academics at the ACC Castle Rock campus and transitioned to the Sturm Collaboration Campus when it opened in the fall, 2019. Maston thanked the navigators and faculty at ACC for all of their support in his academic journey. He hopes his fellow students will seek out all of the helpful resources ACC offers students.

The table below represents our top 5 majors at Sturm Collaboration Campus from spring 2021 as well as a breakout the Associate of Science with Designation category (AS with Designation) to demonstrate the highly concentrated enrollment in biology, pre-engineering and computer science majors.

During the spring 2021 semester there were 174 students enrolled in a Health Career Pathway (138 in 2020); 161 students enrolled in a Technology Career Pathway (84 in 2020); and 147 students enrolled in a Business Career Pathway (98 in 2020).

Although our “on campus” events were unable to happen due to COVID from March 2020 – May 2021, we are starting to see the return. Schomp Automotive and Centura Health are once again returning to campus to hold meetings and trainings, the ACC Foundation had their annual gala with 300 people in attendance in June 2021 and the Castle Rock Chamber will host a 150+ event on campus in August.

In addition, Dr. Eric Dunker, Associate VP and Dean who provides leadership to the Sturm Collaboration Campus and ACC’s workforce partnerships, continues to serve on several regional and national taskforces promoting reskilling and recovery through the COVID-19 crisis. This provides an additional platform for the Sturm Collaboration Campus vision and mission.

These taskforces include:

- ▶ Reskilling and Recovery national network (Colorado team): Led by the national governor’s association and the Lumina foundation with 20 state teams
- ▶ Denver South COVID-19 recovery task force through the South Denver EDP and Workforce boards
- ▶ Colorado State Youth Council board which promotes workforce development for Coloradan’s age 16-24.
- ▶ Arapahoe Douglas Workforce board; where we partnered to co-create nimble and responsive programming for displaced workers in our region. ACC received the Rocky Mountain Workforce Region Proud Partner Award for 2020 for it’s deep partnerships and programming through COVID.
- ▶ Appointed to the Colorado State University Extension Advisory Board for Douglas County by the county commissioners in the summer of 2021 to assist CSU in enhancing programs for youth in the community.

In June 2021, ACC was awarded **\$250,000.00**, to expand apprenticeship programs in Information Technology (IT) and Cybersecurity in Colorado. Funding is available under CCCS’ H-1B Closing the Skills Gap award. ACC will be partnering with an innovative company called Cyber-Up to help increase tech apprenticeships for our students.

ACC is moving into year 3 of our NSF Cyber Security grant, where we’ve received NSA certification as a Center of Excellence and have created programming to help recruit more females to what normally is a male dominated field.

ACC’s Sturm and workforce team continue to lead the way in co-creating new apprenticeships and workforce partnerships. ACC continues to aggressively seek grant funding to expand our work so we can positively effect more Coloradans. For example, during COVID, ACC applied for and was awarded a \$599k Department of Labor grant to provide career coaching and to create robust online health career modules for all contact tracers in Colorado in an effort to assist them in their next career steps. ACC partnered with several state and local agencies to accomplish this programming. While this work was non-credit and primarily online, this demonstrates ACC’s resolve to be nimble and responsive to community needs and to be the leader in Colorado in meeting those needs.

During the 2020 – 2021 academic year, the Arapahoe Community College Sturm Collaboration Campus experienced the following progress in regards to the goals set for the gift of up to \$10 million provided by the Sturm Family Foundation:



Accounting of uses and expenditures of Grant funds

Two streams of work at ACC were enabled with or influenced by the 2019 Sturm grant during the last academic year.

Following the first semester of operation in the Sturm Collaboration Campus, we canvassed faculty, staff and students to identify improvements or iterations we could make to the innovative instructional technology in place. In January 2020, we began ordering and contracting equipment and expertise to make improvements to the technical operation of SCC. While most expenditures for this work occurred during that fiscal year, all work was suspended in March due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Once vendor travel restrictions were lifted in January 2021, we resumed work.

These improvements included expanded switching equipment to handle new and more varied video streams both on site and remotely, room microphones for a better remote experience, and upgrades to podiums and cameras that improved delivery as we came to better understand the real use cases of our faculty and students.

This upgrade work was largely completed by July 2021. When faculty and students return to the campus this fall in larger numbers, they will see more and improved video options in all rooms, better sound and accessibility resources for classes, increased capabilities for ad-hoc screen sharing in all rooms, and improved technology for collaboration.

The second stream of work at ACC influenced by the Sturm grant opportunity relates to our ability to respond to the changing instructional environment during the COVID-19 pandemic. ACC was lucky to use SCC as a model for delivering synchronous, real-time

remote instruction to our students during Covid. The experience of creating the Sturm Collaboration Campus as a technology forward facility, as well as the learnings from how to function effectively in the space during the fall of 2019, was invaluable as we pivoted our instructional model across the broader ACC campus in 2020.

Using our MashMe synchronous learning technology and the equipment supporting it at SCC as a model, we quickly expanded the program using similar equipment, and an improved, lower-cost software solution (Zoom) in over 90 rooms on the rest of our campus. While this expansion was funded through CARES Act dollars, the experience faculty already had under their belts, the back end infrastructure and organization, and the training models to quickly get more faculty up to speed were available as a result of our 'first run' at SCC.

Having the Sturm model for delivering remote instruction in hand and ready to expand across our campuses in the spring of 2021 gave ACC a head start on other institutions, and the success of this preparation is apparent in our increased enrollment and retention numbers, defying national trends in this area.

The Sturm Collaboration Campus Navigators continue to prove that intrusive, wrap around services that align a student's work experience with their program of study as well as career counseling and assessment on the front end of a student's enrollment, positively impact retention and completion rates. Sturm Navigators have approximately 370 students on their case load (vs. 212 Spring 2020)

Through the utilization of the student success platform and alert system, Navigators are able to pay close attention to each student and cohort performance and/or issues. For example, Navigators are alerted when there are outlier performance issues that could be detrimental to student success. For instance, when 5 out of 14 students received a below average grade on

an exam, Navigators were alerted and were able to discuss competencies with the instructor and determine if additional services were needed. Another example is when a student is registered for a class outside of their degree plan, Navigators are alerted and able to follow up (usually with a text to the student) to determine if that class is necessary.

Students at Sturm Collaboration take an average of 9.0 or more credit hours as opposed to the 6.0 or more average of the general ACC student population. This is a significant difference as the momentum of taking more credits proves that students are more likely to graduate and save money on their degree. In addition, Sturm Collaboration Campus students are completing the credit hours they're attempting at 7.6% higher rate than the general ACC student population (89.7% vs. 82.1%).

As mentioned above, Sturm Navigators work directly with employers like Lockheed Martin, Centura Health, Castle Rock Water, and Health One to provide our students with work – based learning experiences, apprenticeships and/or the best opportunities available for their chose field of study. Although, this year proved to be challenging in this remote environment, Navigators have created or increased engagement with the following organizations:

Marketed the ACC Sturm Collaboration Campus pathways at DCSD student/parent information sessions and Student Advising Sessions, statewide conferences and college fairs (see Appendix A).

- Provided Information Sessions for DCSD parents and the community, highlighting ACC Sturm Collaboration Campus pathways

— Serve as the primary academic advisor for more than 100 Douglas County School district students who study at the Sturm Collaboration Campus, and another 2,200 students who need to be registered for Concurrent Enrollment courses (through me) at their Douglas county school district high school location.

- I continue to expand CE’s programming across the Douglas County School district—focusing on creating an academically rewarding experience for more than 2,300 students.
- To support all my students, I have developed a “warm handoff” process through my Leadership Academy project, providing improved wrap-around- student services while utilizing the Navigate platform. To help facilitate “warm handoffs,” I collaborate with Sarah Homer, Anna del Rosario and Jodi Terwillinger-Stacey, to ensure that DCSD CE students have access to the appropriate resources in a timely fashion at the Sturm Collaboration Campus.

- Our Sturm Collaboration Campus CE goals are threefold: 1.) expanding equitable access to underserved students 2.) retaining CE students at the Sturm Collaboration Campus following their HS graduation 3.) setting all students up for success entering the workforce or continuing in their academic pathway.
- As a capstone to the project, I pioneered a graduating “CE Senior Call Campaign” to connect more than 100 underserved students in my service area, with resources for ACC course registration, transcript access and career and transfer services meetings. The expected outcome in ACC’s strategic plan is to “eliminate equity gaps for traditionally underserved students by increasing the course success, retention, and completion rates of all groups”—this continues to be my focus in CE.



- Manages the day-to-day operations for all Douglas County School District CE Students and partnership:
 - As a Concurrent Enrollment Specialist, I currently oversee CE student success operations for diverse academic pathway programs across the Douglas County School District (DCSD), our largest partner. I work in concert with district leaders, principals, counselors, instructors, and students to ensure smooth day-to-day operations of concurrent enrollment programs at the Sturm Collaboration Campus, including Healthcare, Cyber Security, Secure Software, Accounting and Business students.
- Responsible for cultivating and identifying new agreements with partner institutions:
 - As the CE Specialist for Douglas County School district, I continue to work with district leadership to expand and enhance CE pathway opportunities for their accelerating student population's unique academic needs, including Nurse Aide, Automotive and Emergency Medical Technician programs.
- Manages the credentialing and onboarding of new CE instructors, ensures compliance with legislation related to CE, tracks enrollment and outcomes and advises senior leadership on issues related to CE.
 - Assist new instructors and CE liaisons throughout the credentialing and onboarding process for Douglas County School district instructors.
- I have completed my National Alliance of Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships (NACEP) accreditation training and am intimately familiar with the CE legislation across the State of Colorado, as a participant in CE workgroup meetings regarding legislative updates and policy changes in Colorado.
- I delivered my Sturm Collaboration Campus project, "Utilizing Navigate for CE Student Success," to ACC's leadership team gaining cross-campus buy-in to scale our CE student support and advising efforts at Sturm Collaboration Campus.
- I currently provide support for students in diverse academic pathways and programs across Douglas County School District. I have gained extensive knowledge and degree plan understanding across ACC's 7 academic pathways. I also provide academic advising and success tracking for ASCENT students in DCSD—honoring the intersection between each student's Career and Academic Plan (ICAP) and their post-secondary goals. I support these students by utilizing the newly developed "warm handoff" system while collaborating with Sturm Collaboration Campus Navigators and ACC pathway advisors to ensure successful advising, course registration and onboarding student experiences.
- Regarding PTECH, I work closely with CTE Navigator Misty Murphy and Engineering Technology program chair Christopher Gorrie, mining and analyzing data in Navigate to help inform ACC's outreach efforts to PTECH students—supporting matriculation and enrollment growth for our STEM School PTECH partnership.

- I have worked to improve workflows and data management processes for Douglas County School district high school CE students, while creating systems for warm handoffs and wrap-around student support between CE, admissions, advisors, and instructors through the Navigate platform. I am intimately familiar with the new CE Data Load in Banner as well as Banner course building processes, test score data management, CE registration, holds and test score report analysis.
- Created a new “Application Video Tutorials” for Joy Griffin’s team to disseminate to counselor’s, Assistant Principals and instructors, in order to minimize the delay for student to apply to ACC and receive their S Number.
- Maintained records for all Concurrent Enrollment students by utilizing Navigate, Banner, Recruit and other Databases to track CE Student Success; provide holistic, student-centered support through warm hand-offs and “Utilizing Navigate for CE Student Success” project development.

Workplace Skills Development Programing

The Workplace skills development planning program was going to be initiated with more scale in the spring of 2020 as we laid the foundation for the campus during the fall and winter of 2019/2020. Our team also assisted with laying the groundwork to initiate our AWS cloud-computing pilot this summer/fall 2020 along with our CISCO certification program. We had many events planned with the CR Chamber of Commerce late spring, summer, and fall of 2020 to bring more workforce programming to the campus; but these plans were halted due to COVID. However, we have leveraged the carryover funds to help acquire funding from COSI for a position to specifically assist displaced workers back to full employment. Our new employee begins Aug 17th, and this position will leverage some of these funds to bring real time skill development and training to displaced workers through the campus in our region.

ACC applied for and received funding from the Colorado Opportunity Scholarship Initiative to create a Workforce Navigator that will serve displaced workers in Douglas and Arapahoe Counties for the next 2 years. This Workforce Navigator will lean into this fund to provide programming for Douglas County residents through the Sturm Collaboration Campus during the 2021-2022 year.



Information on leasing and other uses of SCC

The lease terms run through June 30, 2024 for CSU, CSU Pueblo and AD Works (who is in the process of moving in). No changes to the lease agreements.

Innosphere uses an open room/public space regularly but no lease.

Due to COVID, the 3D Printing Store will not be leasing space at this time.

Crowfoot Valley Coffee will likely be returning when the campus returns to full capacity for Fall 2021.

In order to meet unprecedented healthcare workforce demand, ACC Sturm Collaboration Campus is opening a 2nd health lab in the fall of 2021. During the initial design for Sturm Collaboration Campus, we put in the option for a second health lab due to the possibility for growth. However, it was clear that our healthcare industry partners needed us to expand our capacity now. We will be repurposing the space that 3D printing was going to lease into a general classroom for the time being in order to keep up with demand.

Progress report on Key Steps to Phase II

Enrollment target head count of 5 – 8% increase year over year was met. Anticipated enrollment for Fall 2021 is projected to increase at least 10%-15% from Fall 2020.

We continue to work with the AD Works chief economist in analyzing workforce demand in our region. ACC's Outreach Team will begin meeting with more businesses this fall to continue assessing programming and regional talent pipeline needs.

The utilization of community event and programming space at Sturm Collaboration Campus was on hold per CDHE and CDC social distancing guidelines due to COVID 19.

Sturm Advisory Committee recruitment initiated including representation from Castle Rock EDC, Douglas County School District, Colorado State University, CR Development Company, Centura Health and Boeing. ACC's new President, Dr. Stephanie Fujii will hold initial meeting in Fall 2021.
