

To view different (ethnic) groups as equal in all their differences and to view inequities between different racialized groups as a problem of policy.*

Anti-racism is the active practice of identifying, challenging, and changing policies which engage or sustain racism.

In doing this, power is redistributed and dispersed in a more equitable manner among racialized groups (groups who have been negatively impacted by racism).
