
How to raise money to go abroad!

5 ways to help you afford going!

Cutting Back!

Sounds obvious but identifying what you can cutback on can make a BIG difference.

Example:

A morning stop at our local coffee shop 2x a week = 2 coffees a week at 4-5 each, for 1 year estimated 416 to 520 in savings.

Do you go out to lunch? Consider taking your lunch instead. 2 lunches a week at \$10 each, for 1 year estimates \$1040.

Start Saving!

Every month take a portion of your earnings and the money you cut back on and set it aside for the trip!

Having a basic savings plan really works.

Raise money with your TALENTS!

Sell art or special items on places like Etsy, Ebay, Facebook, etc.

Pre-sell your art from the trip.

Offer a class or tutoring, like Spanish or art for a group or individual.

Sell your unwanted items online or find a consignment retailer.

Do yard work, shovel snow or help your neighbors for a fee.

Personal Fundraising

EF has a "TripFunder" to help you fundraise. Send your personal link to family and friends and ask for donations.

There are no fees to you or your donor.

"Tell your story", explain how this will benefit your education and career.

Network, Network, Network!

Tell Your Story

- Tell them about your educational goals and degree.
- Tell them about the class you will take.
- Tell them about the cities and places you will visit.
- Tell how it will impact your learning.
- Tell them how this trip impacts your professional and personal goals.
- Tell them how you will use the donations (expenses, food, etc.).
- Tell them how a donation will make a difference in your future.

A personal statement will go a long way!

Use <u>social media</u>!

Facebook, Twitter, Blog, TikTok, Instagram, Snapchat, Pinterest, Text, etc. Use all platforms for all age groups.

Write personal letters.

- Invite them to come to your art show at our gallery.
- Offer them art or a photo from your trip as a thank you.
- Keep track of your donors so you can keep them updated.
- <u>Always</u> send thank you notes!

Post and Re-post your needs for donations!

Stay in touch with your community!

Who is your community? Family, friends, co-workers, neighbors, church members, etc.

Once you identify who you want to send donation information out to, keep them in the loop.

Send them updates on your fundraising progress.

Talk about it on your Instagram, Twitter, Blog, Snapchat or Facebook page so your community can see how much you have raised and how much you still owe.

Create tiers for the donations, \$20 you will send them a post card, \$50 you will get them a key chain, \$100 you will give them a photo and so on.

Good times to ask for donations, holidays, birthdays and graduations.

Photography and Journalism student Kelvin always wanted to travel. He used the EF Tours" TripFunder" to help him with personal fundraising to go Italy and Greece in 2019. Kelvin reached out to members of his community for donations to help make his dreams come true.





Jacob applied for the EF Tours scholarship to help with the cost of the 2018 Japan trip. The essay he wrote included how travel abroad would impact his education, Japanese language skills and career. His inspiring story won him an award.





Sixteen of the Study Abroad students going to Japan were eligible for ACC grants and scholarships, which they put towards their trip.

To be eligible, you must be: Enrolled on an EF College Study program.

18 years of age or older.

A current part-time or full-time student enrolled in an undergraduate- ACC counts.

In good standing with your institution.

In good financial account standing with EF College Study payments.

Scholarship Overview Types: Merit, Financial and Diversity & Equity Apply for one.

Be Prepared

Read every scholarship, grant and award thoroughly. Make sure you are eligibility. Create a check list of what you need to submit. Keep track of the places you apply, the due dates and notification dates. Have all the documents they require, such as:

> A personal statement A reference and/or letter from an instructor GPA and/or proof of good standing with your college Transcripts Proof of trip registration Travel/Class dates Have a video Etc.
