

ARAPAHOE COMMUNITY COLLEGE NURSING PROGRAM AAS NURSING PN-RN (Bridge) PROGRAM

The AAS Nursing, LPN to ADN nursing program option at Arapahoe Community College is a three-semester advanced placement program allowing currently licensed License Practical Nurses career mobility to obtain an Associate of Applied Science in Nursing. Upon successful completion of the LPN to ADN Bridge program, students are eligible to take the NCLEX-RN exam to become a Registered Nurse (RN). There are additional options to obtain your Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) concurrently or immediately following the ADN program. The LPN-ADN Advanced Placement Option (Bridge Program) is a day M-F program comprising 3 credits in the entry semester, 12.5 in the following semester and 9 in the final semester. (Su, F, Sp or F, Sp, F). Clinical rotations may be scheduled on weekends or evenings/nights. Please be aware that the PN-RN Program name will be changing to LPN to ADN Program in the 23-24 Academic Year.

Application/Admission Process effective for ALL Spring 2023 applications: Only one application period will be open beginning February 27 through March 12, 2023. Two cohorts of up to 12 students each will be admitted to either a summer or a fall start. You will be asked your start date preference at the time of application: Summer or Fall or Either. If the number of qualified applicants exceeds the cohort size a random selection process will be used to determine admission offers. Preference will be given to applicants with all prerequisite courses completed prior to application. Conditional acceptance may be extended to applicants with one to two outstanding pre-requisite courses at the time of application. If you have outstanding pre-requisite courses you are encouraged to apply for the Fall 2023 Start, so pre-requisites may be completed in the summer session prior to admission.

Class start date: Summer 2023 or Fall 2023

NUR1089 Transition from LPN to ADN (3 credits) consists of 30 contact hours of theory, 22.5 contact hours of lab, and 22.5 contact hours of clinical. Theory and lab sessions may be held on both the Littleton Campus and the ACC Sturm Collaboration Campus 4500 Limelight Ave., Castle Rock, CO. Clinical sessions may be held in Littleton, Castle Rock, or other locations in the Denver Metro area.

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Arapahoe Community College LPN – ADN Program Admissions Process

Effective for Summer/Fall 2023 Admissions

Online applications for Fall and Summer 2023 program admission will be accepted from February 27-March 12, 2023. Up to 12 students will be conditionally accepted to begin each of the two LPN-ADN cohorts. If more than 12 students qualify for admission for each cohort, a random selection process will be used to determine which students are selected. Students who are accepted must successfully complete NUR1089 Transition from LPN-ADN which is offered at ACC during the Summer and Fall Semesters. A **mandatory** orientation session will be held in May for Summer semester start and will be held in August for the Fall semester start.

Admission is also dependent upon submitting all required clinical compliance documents and passing a background check and urine drug test. See <u>Disqualifying Criminal Offenses</u> Please be aware that although possession of marijuana is not a criminal offense in Colorado, it remains a federal offense. As it is not acceptable to our clinical partners or the CO Board of Nursing, testing positive for marijuana or its metabolites will disqualify you from admission to the nursing program. Important to Know:

- Admission into the ACC LPN-ADN Program is an application process. See attached criteria.
- You must have a current, unencumbered Colorado LPN license.
- All LPN work experience should be summarized and submitted with your application.
- If it has been longer than three years since graduation from your PN program,1000 hours of work experience as an LPN are required prior to application and must be employer verified.
- Unofficial transcripts from all post high school institutions attended, including LPN school must be submitted with your application.
- Applications will be accepted once a year for the following summer and fall admission.
- Any student who has failed two nursing courses within the last two years or is otherwise ineligible to return to any ACC or CCCS nursing program is ineligible to apply.
- Incomplete applications will not be processed, nor will the ACC Nursing Department accept any additional materials after the posted deadline.
- Applicants must meet minimum admission requirements detailed below and apply during the specified application period.
 - Complete the following courses with minimum grade of C and Minimum GPA of 2.5 on the 9 Pre-Requisite Nursing Courses
 - BIO2101 A&P I *
 - BIO2101 A&P II *
 - BIO2104 Microbiology with a Lab *
 - BIO2116 Pathophysiology *
 - ENG 1021 English Composition I or ENG1022, or ENG1031
 - PSY 2440 Human Growth and Development
 - HPR1010 Dietary Nutrition or HWE 1050 Human Nutrition

- MAT1120 Math for Clinical Calculations or higher MAT course recommend any GT Math course
- Approved GT elective from Social/Behavioral Sciences OR Arts & Humanities

*Science courses must have been completed within 10 years of entry into the nursing program to be eligible for transfer approval.

- A maternal/child/pediatrics exam may be administered to assess PN knowledge to guide transition course content. This exam will be administered after admission to the program.
- Clinical compliance requirements include the following. All requirements must be current through the semester:
 - Current American Heart Association BLS for HC Provider
 - Current Health Insurance Coverage
 - Negative PPD TB (Tuberculosis) Skin test expires 1 year from date of test
 - OR if previous positive PPD or BCG Vaccine, chest Xray expires 5 years from date of x-ray
 - MMR 2 doses required or positive titer
 - Hepatitis B 3 doses required or positive titer
 - Varicella (chickenpox)2 doses required or positive titer, History of disease is NOT accepted
 - TDAP Expires 10 years from date of immunization
 - Flu immunization Fall semester due by Oct. 1st
 - Covid-19 Immunization: Follow current CDC recommendations: 2 doses and boosters as recommended. History of disease is NOT accepted. No exemptions are allowed.
 - You may be eligible for Dual Enrollment in the ACC RN-BSN Completion Program after successfully completing NUR1089, NUR2006, NUR212, and NUR2011.

Additional Notes

Any course that has a prefix of **NUR** cannot be taken until you enter the nursing program.

If you are not currently enrolled at ACC, you must Apply to ACC and complete the online application before completing the online PN-RN Program Application. Select Preadmission Nursing option as your major. If you are admitted to the PN-RN Program, you must have your non-ACC transcripts evaluated by the Records and Enrollment Service Office. You will be notified by the nursing department to submit transcripts for evaluation of credit if you have taken any of your prerequisite or general education courses at another college or university. You must have an official transcript sent to the Records and Enrollment Services Office directly from each college or university per the instructions on the ACC Transfer Services web page. Please do not submit transcripts to the Records and Enrollment Services Office until notified to do so by the Nursing Department.

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Nursing Prerequisites and General Education Requirements

Pre-requisites: All must be completed before application to the AAS PN-RN Option

The following **9** courses must be successfully completed with a grade of "C" or better, and you must have a **<u>cumulative GPA of 2.5</u>** in these **9** courses **<u>before</u>** you can apply to the ACC Nursing Program:

IMPORTANT: Science courses cannot be completed more than 10 years prior to entry into the nursing program. If they are more than 10 years old, you will be required to take them again before entry.

The required math course for the nursing program is **MAT 1120 Math for Clinical Calculations** (3 credits) or a higher-level GT-MAT. Placement testing or co-requisites may be required

GT Elective Course Guide

Arts & Humanities and Social & Behavioral Sciences

In **general**, the courses that **many** BSN programs require or will accept as an elective requirement toward the baccalaureate degree in nursing include ANT 1101, PSY 1001, and SOC 1001.

If you are contemplating continuing your education to obtain a BSN, you should contact the school that you plan to attend to ascertain which electives they will accept. **YOU MUST CHOOSE ONE COURSE FROM THE FOLLOWING LIST** of GT (guaranteed transfer) courses to fulfill the elective requirement for the nursing program at ACC.
