

	Scholarship Fund Description
5280 Solutions Scholarship	The fund was created to provide scholarships for students enrolled in Information Technology Programs at Arapahoe Community College including: Broadband Technology and Communication AAS, Computer Information Systems AAS, Computer Network Technology AAS, Computer Support Professional AAS and certificates including Broadband Customer Care, Broadband Technology, Computer Information Systems, Computer Network Technology, Computer Technician and Web Design. The scholarship will cover the tuition for one or more degree or certificate required information technology classes (after the COF stipend), fees, and books as required by the instructor for information technology class(es). Applicants must be a Colorado resident and a full-time student with a 3.0 GPA or higher. If it is a high school graduate, a letter of recommendation from a former instructor may take the place of the 3.0 GPA requirement. The applicant must also submit a one-page essay. The award is renewable as long as the applicant maintains the proper GPA for up to three years.
ACC Foundation Board of Directors	Applicants must have a 3.0 GPA or better and must also be full-time students.
Accounting Scholarship	The Arapahoe Community College Accounting Department has established an ongoing scholarship fund to support students pursuing a career in accounting. The scholarship funds may be used for tuition and/or books for accounting courses at ACC. The applicants must be residents of Colorado and have completed ACC 121 and 122 with a grade of B or higher. The applicants must be planning to pursue a career in accounting and be actively involved in a community service, for example the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program.
Anschutz Family Foundation	The Anschutz fund was created for students that are pursuing a certificate, degree or transfer to a four-year institution. Every effort will be made to award applicants that would not have been able to enroll or persist in their studies without this aid. The applicant must also demonstrate financial need.
Arapahoe Sales Professionals/James P. Boespflug College Scholarship	Financial assistance to students enrolled or planning to enroll in a marketing or business related field of study at Arapahoe Community College. The scholarship may be utilized to pay for tuition, fees and books. Once awarded, the recipient(s) must enroll in and complete a minimum of twelve (12) semester hours of coursework in a marketing or business related field of study.
Boundless Opportunity Scholarship	Designed for students currently enrolled at ACC that are honorably discharged Veterans from the U.S. Armed Forces. Applicants must be a legal resident of Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, or Wyoming. Applicant must enrolled in a minimum of 6 credit hours at ACC and demonstrate financial need through the FAFSA. Applicant must complete an essay and provide a letter of recommendation.
Chuck Wells Scholarship	The fund was created to provide scholarships for students enrolled in the Interior Design program at Arapahoe Community College. The scholarship will cover tuition, fees, books and other materials related to interior design studies. Applicants must be a Colorado resident and a full-time student with a 3.0 GPA or higher that has completed at least 12 credit hours at ACC.
Classified Assembly Book	The fund was created to provide financial assistance to students enrolled at ACC to aid with the cost of books. Applicants must be degree or certificate seeking, completed at least 12 credit hours, a minimum GPA of 2.5 or better and enrolled for a minimum of 6 credit hours.
Colorado Business Bank of Littleton Scholarship	This scholarship is offered to residents of Colorado that are enrolled full-time at ACC. The applicants my have a GPA of 3.0 or better to apply and be pursuing a degree or certificate in Business Administration or Financial Services.
Colorado Trust Endowed Nursing Scholarship	This fund was created for nursing students with a 2.5 GPA or better.
COSI CCCS Matching Scholarships-Colorado Opportunity Scholarship Initiative	The Colorado Opportunity Scholarship Initiative was created for students that are enrolled in a college course, pursuing a program certificate, or degree program. Scholarship Initiative support is available for Colorado students who qualify for a Pell grant and participate in a degree-seeking program, while completing all coursework with a C or better to remain eligible. Preference will be given to create ethnic, cultural and gender diversity among recipients. Need to have a 2.5 GPA in order to apply. Scholarship covers the cost of tuition, fees, books, and support services (tutoring).

The Denver Southeast Rotary Club Foundation	The Denver Southeast Rotary Foundation desires that the funds be awarded to Veterans with a minimum of one (1) year of active duty service. Veterans must have been discharged under an Honorable Discharge. In addition, spouses and former spouses are eligible for consideration if they are or were married to the Veteran while on active duty. This recognizes the fact that when the Veteran serves the Family serves. Duty shortened by medical discharge under Honorable conditions is an exception. Selection of students to receive the awards shall be determined by the appropriate Colorado Community College. However, veterans who served in a combat area as determined by the military with a war zone service medal or other designation, for 180 days or more, must be given preference, unless service is shortened due to combat related injuries. Students must enroll in a degree program or vocational certificate program to be eligible and attend at least half-time as defined by the Colorado Community College System. Scholarships can be used for tuition, books and or school supplies. Scholarship recipients must maintain at least a C plus (2.5 GPA) Academic average, or equivalent in vocational training at a Colorado Community College to be eligible for future funds.
The Diamond Scholarship	The Diamond Scholarship can be used to cover tuition and books. Applicants must be the first person in their immediate family to attend college and must demonstrate financial need. Applicants must be at college level courses and enrolled full-time. Applicants must also be enrolled in an Associate of Arts or an Associate of Science transfer degree program with the intention of continuing to a four-year institution for a Bachelor's degree. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 or better to apply and maintain as long as they are receiving funds. Renewable.
Dr. Leahbeth Barnard Endowed Scholarship	The fund was created to provide financial assistance to women who are single or in the process of a divorce and/or who present extenuating circumstances.
Early Childhood Education Scholarship	This scholarship is offered to ACC students enrolled in the Early Childhood Teacher Education program, certificate or course. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better to apply and must maintain a 2.5 GPA or better throughout the year. Preference will be given to degree and certificate seeking students, students currently employed in the field of early childhood education and students closer to degree completion.
Ellie and Manny Greenberg	Applicants for this scholarship must be residents of Colorado and have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better to apply. Current ACC applicants must have completed at least 12 credit hours as shown by an unofficial transcript, while high school graduates may provide the transcript showing a cumulative GPA of 3.0 to apply. Applicants must be full-time students.
First Generation Scholarship	<p>The goals and objectives of ACC's First-Generation Scholarship Program are based upon a synthesis of research evidence from hundreds of studies over the past decade: low-income, minority first-generation students are more likely to need financial assistance in order to attend college; parents of first-generation students lack an understanding of the college experience and often do not provide encouragement to their children in dealing with challenging situations that college presents; first-generation college students have a difficult time balancing the demands of being a family member with the requirements of college study; first-generation students often have trouble understanding grading and course systems, completing financial aid applications, as well as navigating the overall bureaucracy of higher education; and first-generation students that attend college on a full-time basis are more successful than those that attend part-time.</p> <p>Once they arrive on the college campus, first-generation students need personalized attention. Immediate confirmation that they are working toward a college degree is essential to retention. Peer support and strategically-timed intervention keeps first-generation students on track with their studies plus involves them in college-wide activities essential to interaction with the college environment. First-generation students need structured opportunities with staff and peers to encourage academic achievement, transition to four-year institutions, and career planning. They also need (and want) ongoing feedback, using measurable outcomes to assess their academic progress. Funding from the Peierls Foundation for Learning, Inc. will assist ACC in accomplishing the program goals and objectives.</p>
Freda T. Roof Memorial	The fund was created to provide financial assistance to worthy and needy students. Applicants must demonstrate financial need.
General Student Scholarship	To provide financial assistance to students in need.

Hoff Miller	The fund was created to assist students in the Interior Design program. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better to apply and completed half of the coursework required for an Associate of Applied Science degree in Interior Design. Applicants must be residents of Colorado and must be enrolled in at least 6 credit hours each semester. The scholarship may be used to cover tuition and books.
James McKechnie	Applicants must be residents of Colorado and complete an essay. The scholarship will be awarded at a Littleton Rotary Club meeting.
Judith A. Ganschaw	The fund was created to provide financial assistance to students pursuing an Associate of Applied Science with a major in accounting. The scholarship may be used to cover tuition, books and fees. Applicants must have earned an "A" in Accounting 121 and 122 and in one other accounting course required for the Associate of Applied Science Accounting major. Applicants must enroll in any subsequent accounting course that is required for the Associate of Applied Science in accounting. Applicants must be a declared Associate of Applied Science degree candidate with a major in accounting. Once awarded, the scholarship is renewable for subsequent accounting classes as long as an "A" is achieved in each accounting class taken and the most recent faculty member concurs in writing that the student has demonstrated academic prowess, determination and ethical behavior. Preferences, but not required, for first generation students and renewable award.
Kaiser Permanente	Applicants must be in a Health Science program. Applicants must also have a 2.5 GPA or better and must also be full-time students. Preference will be given to create ethnic, cultural and gender diversity among recipients. Additional preference will also be given to first generation and low socioeconomic students. The scholarship can be used to cover tuition, fees and/or books and supplies.
Kevin Patterson Memorial Scholarship	The fund was created to provide financial assistance to ACC students with a cumulative 2.5 GPA or better and maintain that GPA, while receiving funds from the scholarship. Applicants must be U.S. citizens and be degree seeking or in a CTE program. Funds must go towards the first 60 credit hours at ACC and may cover tuition, books and fees. Preference given to, but not limited to, direct relatives of Kevin Patterson.
Leonard Mullis Endowed Scholarship	The fund was created to provide financial assistance to ACC students with a cumulative 2.5 GPA or better and maintain that GPA, while receiving funds from the scholarship. Applicants must be U.S. citizens and demonstrate financial need. Funds may be used to cover tuition, books and fees.
Lido Wine Merchants Humanities Scholarship	The fund was created to provide financial assistance to students enrolled in the Humanities program at ACC. The scholarship may be used to cover tuition and books. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 or better and maintain as long as they are receiving funds. Applicants must answer one of the two essay questions.
Mark J. Smith	The fund was created to provide financial assistance to students enrolled in, or planning to enroll in, a business related field of study at ACC. Applicants must demonstrate financial need and have a GPA of 3.0 or above to apply. First preference to, but not limited to, students who were raised from a single-parent household. The scholarship may be used to cover tuition and books.
McKinnell Scholarship	The fund was created to provide financial assistance to students enrolled in Ceramics at ACC. Applicants must demonstrate financial need and provide a written description of a project that includes benefits to the grantee, the ceramics department and the ceramics community at large with a way to share the experience with the college and community (slide presentation, demonstration, publication). A written description to work in the field and a portfolio of work must also be provided. The recipient will be required to provide a written evaluation of their experience within 60 days of completion.
New American	The fund was created to provide financial assistance to immigrant students who are enrolled at ACC. The scholarship may be used to cover tuition and books. Applicants must be an immigrant who has become a "documented immigrant".
Rockley Family Scholarship	This fund is to provide financial assistance to students enrolled at ACC and may be utilized to pay for tuition fees and books. Applicants must be current students in good standing, who demonstrate financial need, and enrolled in at least one music class. Applicants must write a one page essay describing how this scholarship will assist them in achieving their educational goals.
Service Above Self Centennial Rotary Scholarship	The Centennial Rotary Foundation offers a scholarship to applicants that demonstrate financial need, are enrolled and in good standing with ACC and that will work with the Centennial Rotary Club on one or more of its community service projects involving an estimated commitment of 6 to 9 hours over the course of the academic year. There will be three volunteer events with an estimated 2 to 3 hour commitment and the recipient will be expected to attend two Tuesday morning Centennial Rotary Club meetings during the academic year. Applicants must answer the questions in written form as well to qualify for the scholarship.



The Ray and Marilyn Art Scholarship	The fund was created to provide financial assistance to students enrolled in an Art program at ACC. Applicants must be a first year, full-time student, taking 5 classes per semester in the Associate of Arts degree program. Applicants must be a recent graduate from Chatfield, Columbine, Dakota Ridge, Heritage or Littleton High School. Applicants must demonstrate financial need and have a GPA of 2.4 or better to apply.
Town and Gown	The fund was created to provide financial assistance to ACC students with preference to, but not limited to, students enrolled in the Paralegal program and involved in community service activities. The scholarship may be used to cover tuition, books and/or living expenses. Applicants must be residents of Colorado and be a high school graduate or received a GED with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better. Applicants must register for at least 6 credit hours per semester and continue with coursework leading to a certificate or degree.
Western Welcome Week Scholarship	To provide financial assistance to students enrolled in the Events Management Program.
Writers Studio	To provide financial assistance to students enrolled in the Associate of Arts Degree with a Creative Writing emphasis.
