## WELCOME TO ACC

**1. APPLY FOR ADMISSION** ACC has an open door admissions policy, meaning entry is generally unrestricted for students 17 and over. **Returning students** who were not enrolled in the previous year must reapply to update address and residency information.

- Go to [www.arapahoe.edu](http://www.arapahoe.edu). Click on **Apply** in the Apply Now box. Create a temporary application Login ID and PIN.
- Click **Login** and follow prompts to complete all required information. Read directions carefully.
- Your **Student ID Number ("S Number")** will be emailed to you with your acceptance information (as long as you provide an email on the application). This number is your access to all College activities and services.

**2. APPLY FOR THE COLLEGE OPPORTUNITY FUND (COF)** at [www.arapahoe.edu](http://www.arapahoe.edu) > Paying for College. The College Opportunity Fund link is on the left side. Colorado subsidizes in-state tuition for residents through COF, **but you must apply to receive this benefit**. Remember to authorize your stipend through ACC when registering for classes.

**3. ASSESSMENT** of basic skills in writing, reading and math is required for all new students and recent high school graduates. A review for the computerized placement test is available on our website. To test you must:

- Pay a \$10 fee at the Cashier's Office or in the Testing Center.
- Present a state or government photo ID.

If you have taken the ACCUPLACER assessment at another school in the last five years you can request your school send it to the Testing Center.

ACCUPLACER scores that will place you into college level course work are an 80 in reading along with a 95 in Sentence Skills, and an 85 or higher in Elementary Algebra. If you can provide ACT or SAT scores taken in the last five years or prior college coursework in math, reading or English, you may not need to take an ACCUPLACER test. ACT scores to place in college-level coursework are English 18, math 19 and reading 17. SAT scores to place in college classes are 440 verbal and 460 math.

If ACC determines you need basic skills instruction in math, reading or writing based on your assessment scores, you must take the required courses within the first 30 hours of attendance at a Colorado community college.

**4. ORIENTATION AND ADVISING** are required for all New students and strongly encouraged for Transfer students or ACC returning students who have been out of attendance for one year or more.

- Assessment (English, Reading, Mathematics) must be completed prior to attending an Orientation session.
- Visit [www.arapahoe.edu/Orientation](http://www.arapahoe.edu/Orientation) for more information and to RSVP for a session.

**5. COURSE REGISTRATION** There are deadlines by which a course may be added, dropped or withdrawn from.

- **Continuing students** are encouraged to register online.
- **New Students** can register after completing Assessment and attending Orientation
- **Returning students** who have not been enrolled in the previous year must reapply to update address and residency information. Then are encouraged to register online.
- Go to **myACC** at [www.arapahoe.edu](http://www.arapahoe.edu) and enter your Student ID Number and password.

Logon to **myACC**. On the Student Tab, select **Add or Drop a Class** (under Registration Tools), then select the correct term. Scroll down and enter a **five-digit CRN** in the box provided. You can enter several CRNs at once. If you do not know the CRN, select Class Search. When done, click **Submit Changes**.

To print a schedule, select **Detailed Student Schedule** under Registration Tools.

## Drop a Course

Login to **myACC**. On the Student tab, select **Add or Drop a Class** (under Registration Tools), then select the correct term. Click on **Action Menu** next to the CRN, then the **Drop Web** option, then **Submit Changes**.

**“NO-SHOW” STUDENTS** Students who do not attend prior to the course Census (add / drop) date, and who are identified as a “No show” by their Instructor, will be dropped. However, it is ultimately the student’s responsibility to ensure accuracy of their class schedule. Attendance in an online course is defined as accessing the course and completing at least one academic activity.

**REGISTRATION IN CLOSED CLASSES** You **must** attend the first class meeting to seek Instructor permission to enroll. If the Instructor gives you permission to enroll, he/she will sign your **Schedule Adjustment Form**. Return this form to Information Central to complete registration. You must be properly registered before the Census (add/drop) Date. Call Admissions and Records for more information, 303.797.5621.

**ACC NOTIFICATION SYSTEM** Students may sign up for the ACC Notification System to receive text messages regarding campus closures, campus emergencies and missing account information. To sign up for this service, logon to myACC and click on the ACC Notification System link in the Feedback and Surveys section.

**ACCOUNT AGREEMENT** All students wanting to register for courses at ACC must read and accept an [Account Agreement](#) each semester, acknowledging that they understand the financial obligations they undertake when registering for courses.

**BOOKS** are available at the Littleton campus by mail (call 303.797.5676 or FAX 303.795.3657) or on our website. Have the course and section numbers of your classes to get the right course materials. Review the refund and return policy. Parker Campus and Castle Rock Campus students should order books at the Littleton campus Bookstore, by mail or online.

**CANCELLED CLASSES** If the number of students enrolled in any class is insufficient to offer it, the class may be cancelled by the School Dean. ACC will notify you of cancelled classes as soon as possible. For help finding another class, contact Advising at 303.797.5664.

**CAREER & TRANSFER CENTER** Job postings, resumé writing, interview techniques, career counseling, computer programs providing career assessments and information on occupations are available. Call 303.797.5805 or visit Room AM2005.

**CHANGE OF NAME OR ADDRESS** You must notify Admissions and Records of any change of address, name, email, telephone number or other status that affects your permanent records. Name changes must be made in person or by fax with signature and must be accompanied by official documentation indicating the name change. Address, email and telephone number changes can be made online.

**CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER/PRESCHOOL SERVICES** The Center serves children starting at 2 ½ yrs. of age. The Center is open Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-5 p.m. For more information call 303.797.5678.

**DISABILITY SERVICES** If you have a documented disability, contact Disability Services to request accommodations. Call 303.797.5937 or visit Room AM2710.

**FINANCIAL AID** Apply for financial aid at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). Apply as early as possible for the best forms of aid available. Applications received by April 1 have first priority. If you complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), you must include **ACC’s school code, 001346**. For most forms of aid, you must enroll in at least six credit hours. Changes in enrollment status or attendance may impact financial aid awards.

**GRADUATION APPLICATIONS** are available via **myACC**. The application and \$30 charge are due by the semester deadline. Deadlines are: Summer-June 30; Fall-October 31; Spring-March 15. Applications submitted after the deadline will be processed for the next semester (e.g. application for Summer graduation submitted on July 2 will be processed as a Fall application.)

**myACC** provides access to account information, registration (adding/dropping/withdrawing from classes), student email, online courses, announcements, deadline notification and many other resources.

**PARKING PERMITS** are required for all campus lots. To get a permit, take your payment receipt and class schedule to the Campus Police office, Room AM2630. Permits allow parking in ACC lots but do not guarantee a space. **The Art and Design Center** requires a Lot J parking permit, available only for students currently taking classes at the Center. Visitor day passes are available at Information Central or the Campus Police office. Fines from \$15-\$50 are assessed for not displaying a valid permit when parking in ACC lots.

**RESIDENCY STATUS** In-state tuition is based on the information you provide on your application. To be eligible for in-state tuition, applicants (or the parents of applicants under 23) must show physical presence with intent to create domicile in Colorado for at least 12 consecutive months before the first day of the semester.

**STUDENT AFFAIRS** provides activities and leadership opportunities (student government and clubs) for all students. Student Affairs is also responsible for student grievances and judicial affairs. Room AM2820.

**STUDENT PHOTO ID** is your key to ACC activities, discounts and special events. Get your ID at the Campus Police office, Room AM2630. You must present a valid government-issued photo ID, payment receipt and class schedule.

**SNOW CLOSURE** information will be available on local television and radio stations and also posted on our website.

**STUDENT SUCCESS CENTER** offers free professional tutors, math and writing Instructors, peer tutors and online skill-building lessons in vocabulary, grammar, math and algebra. Call 303.797.5669 or visit Room AM2720.

**TRANSFER CREDITS** You must have an official transcript sent directly to the Admissions and Records office from your prior college(s); hand-delivered transcripts and / or those marked as "Issued to Student" are not considered official. Credits that apply to your declared program will be posted after you are enrolled.

**VETERAN BENEFITS** If you are eligible to receive veteran educational benefits including Active Duty GI Bill, Reserve/National Guard GI Bill, Dependent Educational Assistance or VA Vocational Rehabilitation, you can get help in the Financial Aid Office, Room AM2330.

Apply for benefits at [www.gibill.va.gov](http://www.gibill.va.gov), click **Apply Online**. VA educational benefits typically take six-eight weeks to process and are paid retroactively (for example: you will be paid in October for attendance in September) directly to the applicant. ACC will not hold you in your classes for an unpaid bill based on pending VA benefits payments. If you get VA benefits you must arrange to pay your bill at the Cashier's Office by the due date.

**WAITLIST REGISTRATION** Effective for the Summer 2013 semester, ACC is implementing an automated notification system for students who have signed up on a waitlist for a course (for those limited courses at ACC with a waitlist). When a spot opens in the course, the next student on the waitlist will receive a Registration Notification email (to their student email account ONLY). That student has 48 hours from the Registration Notification email date/time to register in the course. If the student does not register within the 48 hour timeframe, they are dropped from the waitlist and lose their spot. It is critical that any student on a waitlist checks their Student Email daily for the Registration Notification email and takes action immediately.

**WESTERN UNDERGRADUATE EXCHANGE (WUE)** is a program which allows students in many western states to enroll in many college programs **at reduced tuition**. Rates apply only to traditional course delivery. See [www.wiche.edu](http://www.wiche.edu) for information.

## OPTIONS FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

High school students can get a jumpstart on college by taking ACC classes.

ACC Concurrent Enrollment is a program that partners with local school districts to offer college classes to high school students. Concurrent enrollment courses may be offered at the high school during the school day or students may take classes at an ACC campus. Check with your high school counselor to learn which options are available to you. Tuition and fees help cover part of the cost of your education and many student services. The amount of your tuition depends on the number of credit hours you register for, your residency status, whether you have signed up for the College Opportunity Fund stipend and if you have authorized the State of Colorado to pay a portion of your tuition bill. Some fees are **NON-REFUNDABLE**.

All students wanting to register for courses at ACC must read and accept an [Account Agreement](#) each semester, acknowledging that they understand the financial obligations they undertake when registering for courses.

**MYPAYMENTPLAN** can help you meet your education expenses. **MyPaymentPlan** is a low-cost option for budgeting tuition and other expenses. The cost to budget monthly payments is \$35/agreement, nonrefundable. **MyPaymentPlan** can be accessed via **myACC**. Call the Cashier's Office, 303.797.5638, for more information. You must complete **MyPaymentPlan** agreement by **August 13, 2014** to ensure enrollment for the **FALL 2014 semester**.

**PAYMENT TERMS** **Do not wait for a bill.** To prevent being dropped from your classes for outstanding balance, your account must be paid in full or you must have a deferred payment plan by the date and time listed in the **FALL** calendar of this Schedule. If a sponsor is paying your bill, submit written documentation to the Cashier's Office by the payment date or specified date and time. If you apply for late financial aid awards you are responsible for paying your bill unless notified by the Financial Aid office of successful enrollment.

If you register after the listed payment date you must pay your account in full or initiate a deferred payment plan by 5 p.m. on the date enrolled. **Lack of a receipt of a bill does not relieve you of your financial obligation to the College.**

**REFUND POLICY** A financial obligation to the College occurs when you register for classes. Refunds are granted only when classes are officially dropped in person or online by the official refund (drop) date. This date varies depending on the class beginning and ending dates. Students who drop classes before the course Census (Add / Drop) Date will receive a 100% tuition refund. No refunds are granted after the Census (Add / Drop) Date of the class.

If you withdraw from classes and have an unpaid balance, you are responsible for full payment. ACC forwards unpaid accounts to State [approved collection agencies](#). The State of Colorado withholds balances due from Colorado tax refunds. Financial aid recipients who withdraw and / or stop attending their course(s) may owe a repayment of Title IV funds received. Visit the Financial Aid Office, Room AM2330, for more information.

**ACTIVE DUTY MILITARY PERSONNEL** and their dependents are eligible for in-state tuition by providing certification from the military base Education Office each semester. More information is available from Admissions and Records, Room AM2480.

## CLASS FORMATS AND SECTION RANGES

**TRADITIONAL CLASSES** meet in the classroom at specified times. Section numbers are 100-199.

**ONLINE CLASSES** require that you have a computer with Internet access and email. You may use computers in the Open Computer Lab to meet your online requirements. ACC Online section numbers are 200-299.

**HYBRID** classes require less classroom time than traditional classes and provide additional activities online. You may use computers in the Open Computer Lab to meet the online requirements of these classes. Hybrid section numbers are 300-399.

**ACCELERATED** There are three Accelerated modules per semester. You can start with any module during the semester. Accelerated classes require less classroom time than traditional classes (less than 45 contact hours), plus additional hours by arrangement with significant outside classroom coursework. Accelerated section numbers are 400-499.

**ARRANGEMENT** classes require you to complete projects or other required class activities with faculty direction. Arrangement section numbers are 500-599.

**FLEX/LAB** classes allow you to learn at your own pace. Instructors will be available to answer questions, support your progress and promote your success. They will post hours in the classroom. Flex/Lab section numbers are 600-699.

**CO-OP/INTERNSHIP** is a period of apprenticeship for you to work off-campus, under supervision, providing an opportunity to learn practical applications of classroom material. Co-Op/Internship section numbers are 700-799.

**WEBCAST COURSES** provide the access convenience of online courses, with the in-person faculty and student interaction of traditional classroom-based courses. Students attend Webcast courses on scheduled days and times, but they attend via the web utilizing software that allows the students and faculty to see and interact with each other. Webcast section number is 1WC.

Use, being under the influence, manufacturing, possession, cultivating, distribution, purchase, or sale of alcohol and/or drugs (illegal and/or dangerous or controlled substance) and/or alcohol/drug paraphernalia while on college owned or college controlled property, and/or at any function authorized or supervised by the college and/or in state owned or leased vehicles.

**Note:** *Although possession and use of marijuana consistent with the requirements of the Colorado Constitution is no longer a crime in the State of Colorado, the possession and use of marijuana remains illegal under federal law. Consistent with federal law, including the Controlled Substances Act and the Drug Free Schools and Communities Act, the use and/or possession of marijuana continues to be prohibited while a student is on college owned or college controlled property, and/or any function authorized or supervised by the college and/or in state owned or leased vehicles*

### Legal Sanctions

There are legal sanctions for violations of the Code of Conduct. Any student convicted of the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession, use or abuse of illicit drugs or alcohol is subject to criminal penalties under local, state or federal law. These penalties range in severity from a fine of \$100 to \$8,000,000 and/or imprisonment. The exact penalty assessed depends upon the nature and severity of the individual offense.

### College Penalties

The College will issue sanctions against students who violate the Code of Conduct. Violators will be subject to disciplinary action under student disciplinary policies. Sanctions include, but are not limited to, probation, suspension or expulsion from the College or probation, suspension or termination of employment; and referral to authorities for prosecution, as appropriate.

### Health Risks

Many health risks are associated with drug and alcohol abuse. Risks include: malnutrition, brain damage, heart disease, pancreatitis, cirrhosis of the liver, mental illness, death, low birth-weight babies, and babies with drug addictions. Personal relationships, family dynamics, ability to work and study are also at risk. Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Program information and counseling resources are through the Student Affairs Office and Human Resources.

### Illegal Substances

A controlled substances schedule is on file in the Student Affairs Office (Room M2820). Illegally possessing, using, distributing or manufacturing any narcotic, dangerous drug or controlled substance as classified by federal, state, and local laws or appearing on campus while under the influence of any illegally-obtained narcotic, dangerous or controlled substance is a crime and violation of the Student Code of Conduct

### Amendment 64 Information

In November 2012, Colorado voters passed Amendment 64 to the Colorado Constitution. This amendment changed Colorado law to allow people 21 or over to cultivate, consume and possess limited amounts of marijuana in private, not in public. In light of the public nature of our campuses, any marijuana use or possession on campus would run contrary to this restriction. This amendment does not alter existing policies at Arapahoe Community College prohibiting the possession, use, and distribution of marijuana by students, employees, and all visitors on College property.

## FAIR AND ACCURATE CREDIT TRANSACTIONS ACT (FACTA)

In accordance with the Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act (FACTA) of 2003, Arapahoe Community College adheres to the Federal Trade Commission's (FTC) Red Flag Rule (A Red Flag is any pattern, practice, or specific activity that indicates the possible existence of identity theft.), which implements Section 114 of the FACTA and to the Colorado Community College System's Identity Theft Prevention and Detection Program, which is intended to prevent, detect and mitigate identity theft in connection with establishing new covered accounts or an existing covered account held by the Colorado Community College System (System or CCCS) or one of its thirteen (13) community colleges, and to provide for continued administration of the Program. 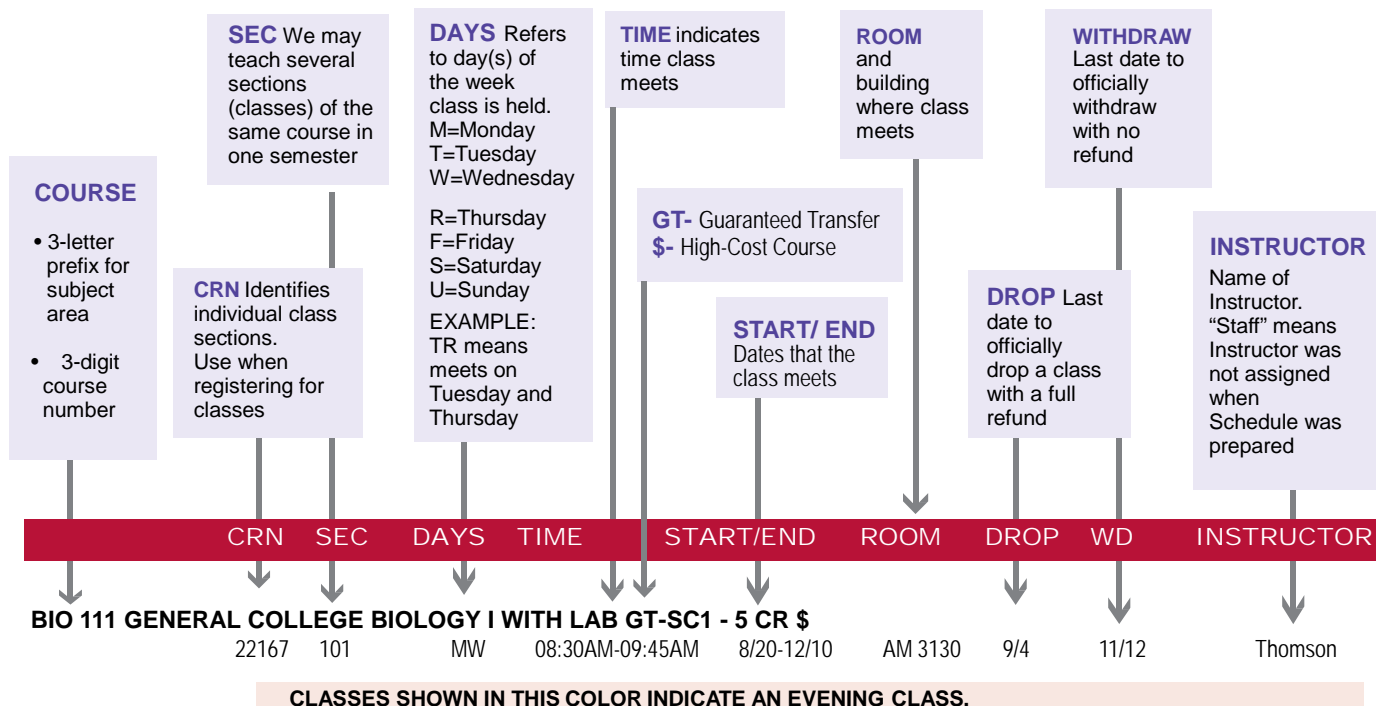
